Have you noticed the new toy chest labeled "TOYS FOR TOMAGWA" at St. Timothy? You & your whole family have a new way to help our newest Local Mission by donating small, new or gently used toys for the children seen at the TOMAGWA clinics. TOMAGWA treats dozens of children every month for illnesses, injuries, general health, vaccinations, dentistry, etc., and there is a continuous need to help ease the difficulties these kids might encounter when seen by a healthcare worker. Every patient aged 1 - 12 yrs. is allowed to choose 1 toy from the toy chests at the clinics that will help comfort them through whatever processes they may experience at the clinic. The toy can be a small doll, a stuffed animal, a blanket, a car or truck, an action hero or space hero, a book, a coloring book and crayons, a children's prayer book or Bible or any other small (non-battery operated) item. The St. Timothy TOYS FOR TOMAGWA toy chest accepts toys at any time and will be lovingly distributed at TOMAGWA by staff when the need arises.
