Children's Sunday School Offering

Sunday School in the month of November will focus on the Beatitude statements that Jesus made in Matthew 5. Each statement starts with the same word, which we translate as "Blessed." "Happy" is a legitimate translation however, the problem is that in today's world, "happy" can sound trite. "Happy" tends to connote a "feeling," rather than, the state of one's soul. And make no mistake... Jesus was talking about what makes our soul, our life, really happy. The term, "Blessed," can also be misunderstood. "Blessings" in today's English is often thought of as something we are given, rather than, a way to act or the soul's state.



In Sunday School we will be taking a special offering during the month of November that will help us learn to give back – to live a life of blessing others. This offering will get spent on <u>December 5th</u> to purchase all the supplies for our church-wide Advent Service Projects. We will discuss every week that our offerings will go to help: children in Bright Beginners know more about Jesus; children in emergency rooms know that Jesus loves them; and appreciating our Bright Beginners and Hancock Elementary school teachers.

New Bible Classes: Nov. 4 - Dec. 16

The Holidays are Here! Thanksgiving and Christmas give us the chance to evaluate our level of gratitude for all God's gifts, as well as understand the true meaning of the greatest gift found in Jesus as our Savior. Using the video teaching of Andy Stanley and Pete Briscoe, this class will provide guidance in a consumer-

driven society for the person who desires more out of the holiday season. Discussion led by Pastor Steve and Pastor Brad in 201. Pastor Steve and Pastor Brad are dedicated shepherds of the flock at St. Timothy. They work together to preach and teach truth from scripture, leading others to know God's heart for His people.

How to Read and Understand the Old Testament

Have you ever wanted to read the Old Testament, but were intimidated by the unpronounceable names, confusing story line, and laws about mildew and leprosy? This class will provide a safe place for questions as we lay out an understandable overview of the people, places, and how God was working to prepare the world for a Savior. Led by Gloria Ruppel in 101. Gloria serves on staff at St. Timothy as Director of Mission and Ministry. She oversees adult Bible classes, local and overseas missions, and adult ministries at St. Timothy. She finds great joy in getting to know people and introducing them to the life of fullness only found in Christ.

Esther: The Unseen Hand of God This study will explore the only book of the Bible that does not mention God by name but shows His power and His hand at work in the world. God is in control even when we can't see it. God can even use those who do not believe in Him for His greater purpose. Led by Heather Harmann in 203. Heather and husband, Craig, are in the busy season of life, raising children and working while still focusing on being followers of Jesus Christ. She is

currently working on her master's degree in Theology in order to teach and inspire others to live a life that honors God.

Grace-Based Parenting Too often well-meaning parents create rigid rules and checklists for "holy" behavior intended to make children more spiritual. Grace-based parenting, on the other hand, mirrors God's love and forgiveness and displaces fear as a motivator. It's not only about loving your children as God does, but also helps you decide which behaviors really need curbing, deciding which rules need to be written in pencil rather than blood, and making grace, not fear, the driving force in your family. Study guides which are very helpful to expand class discussion are available for purchase for \$10. Led by Alison

Scott in 202. Alison and her husband Josh are in the thick of raising children and teaching them to live with integrity and follow Jesus with their whole heart. Both Josh and Alison are elementary teachers who have a heart for living their faith each day with their students and co-workers.

Genesis: History or Metaphor? Does it really matter if the book of Genesis (especially the first nine chapters) is an historical account? These chapters describe the creation of the universe, the formation of our planet, the first people, the entrance of sin and its consequences, and the destruction of the Flood. A person who is not familiar with the Biblical record might say these chapters should be understood as a metaphor or a symbolic guide to God's interest and care. If you are interested in seeing why these early chapters of Genesis really do matter, and how the Biblical account can be understood as history, then this class is for you! Come and join us as we study Genesis 1-9 and discuss the information in the light of 21st century science. Bring your Bible and an honest desire to understand these important

chapters. Led by Noel Atzmiller in 102/103. Noel takes the study of the Bible very seriously, even though each one of his classes begin with his famous "top ten bad jokes." Noel has led Bible studies for many years and provides many historical and archeological insights into each lesson.
