### Learning Without Tears!

These girls are working hard on mastering writing letters. This activity is called, "Wet, Dry, Try." They begin with a letter written on their board, trace the letter with a wet sponge, trace the wet lines with a paper towel and then



write the letter with chalk. This creates muscle memory and helps the children to learn letter recognition at the same time that they are practicing their handwriting skills.
