Risk taking promotes learning by helping children develop essential skills like problem-solving, resilience, confidence and decision-making through exposure to uncertainty in a safe environment. It teaches children to learn from failure, manage fear, explore new interests and adapt to challenges. This is crucial for their cognitive, physical, and emotional growth. When children learn to take risks in their play, they will be prepared for taking risks when learning how to read and solve math problems.

Mrs. Melissa noticed that her class was having trouble taking risks in their drawing and artwork. They read the book "Ish," by Peter Reynolds, together and learned that it is okay for things to not turn out perfectly. Check out some of their *ish* artwork!
